Getting Involved

Critique is currently accepting submissions for the 2024 Winter volume. The deadline for submission is the 1st of April.

We accept manuscripts year-round, those received after the deadline will be automatically considered for the next publication.

Critique is also looking for undergraduates, postgraduates, and graduates worldwide to join the peer reviewing process.

Submissions

Critique accepts submission of the following papers:

- Articles under 8,000 words on any area of philosophy
- Reviews under 3,500 words of philosophic books published within the last 4 years
- Discussion pieces under 5,000 words of articles published in undergraduate journals

Peer Review

Applicants should send the following to the Editor at <u>durhamcritique@gmail.com</u>:

- Your name
- Your course
- Your year of study
- Your areas of specialization and/or areas of competency
- The role you are primarily interested in
- Other roles you would be interested in if your primary application is unsuccessful
- A statement of no more than 500 words regarding your suitability for the role

A reference from an academic or somebody in an administrative position, at Durham University or elsewhere, would strengthen your application.
