

Playing with lines

Op Art just means optical illusion, and is a type of art that can play a trick on your eyes. By laying lines and shapes over the top of each other, you can create a piece of artwork that looks like it's moving!

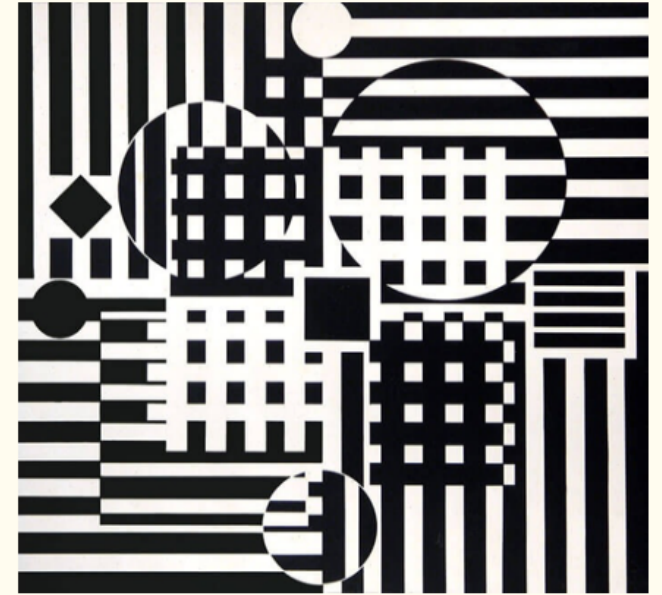


Try recreating the artwork Jerusa by Victor Vasarely. Draw using black and white to make your lines stand out, or use two contrasting colours.

Once you have covered your page fully, cut out circles from the page - ask an adult to help you.

Finally, twist your circles around so the lines no longer match up!
